Assistant / Associate / Professor (Tenure Line)

Stanford University School of Medicine seeks to fill two full-time tenure line (or tenured) faculty positions in the Division of Epidemiology, Department of Health Research and Policy. The predominant criterion for appointment in the University Tenure Line is a major commitment to research and teaching. [We seek applicants with demonstrated research excellence in any epidemiology specialty, but priority will be given to individuals working in one or more of the following areas: genetic epidemiology, cancer epidemiology, pharmacoepidemiology, cardiovascular epidemiology, psychiatric epidemiology, and infectious disease epidemiology.](#) The appointments may be either the Assistant, Associate or Professor level, depending on the qualifications of the candidates. We expect that each candidate will have a Ph.D. or equivalent in epidemiology or an M.D. with master's level training in epidemiology.

We will expect successful candidates to develop an independent program of research in their field and to assist in the teaching programs for clinical investigators and epidemiologists within the School of Medicine. We are particularly interested in mid-career investigators. [The successful candidate will have: 1\) demonstrated success in obtaining peer-reviewed research funding, 2\) peer-reviewed research publications, and 3\) evidence of excellence in teaching and mentoring.](#)
